DETAINEE PHOTOGRAPHIC RECORDS PROTEC-4 5 TION. 6 (a) SHORT TITLE.—This section may be cited as the 7 "Detainee Photographic Records Protection Act of 2009". 8 (b) DEFINITIONS.—In this section: (1) COVERED RECORD.—The term "covered 9 10 record" means any record— 11 (A) that is a photograph that—

(i) was taken during the period beginning on September 11, 2001, through January 22, 2009; and

(ii) relates to the treatment of individuals engaged, captured, or detained after
September 11, 2001, by the Armed Forces
of the United States in operations outside
of the United States; and

20 (B) for which a certification by the Sec21 retary of Defense under subsection (c) is in ef22 fect.

(2) PHOTOGRAPH.—The term "photograph" encompasses all photographic images, whether originals or copies, including still photographs, negatives,

3	(c) CERTIFICATION.—
4	(1) IN GENERAL.—For any photograph de-
5	scribed under subsection $(b)(1)(A)$, the Secretary of
6	Defense shall submit a certification to the President,
7	if the Secretary of Defense, in consultation with the
8	Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, determines
9	that the disclosure of that photograph would endan-
10	ger—
11	(A) citizens of the United States; or
12	(B) members of the Armed Forces or em-
13	ployees of the United States Government de-
14	ployed outside the United States.
15	(2) CERTIFICATION EXPIRATION.—A certifi-
16	cation submitted under paragraph (1) and a renewal
17	of a certification submitted under paragraph (3)
18	shall expire 3 years after the date on which the cer-

20	mitted to the President.
21	(3) CERTIFICATION RENEWAL.—The Secretary
22	of Defense may submit to the President—

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(4) NOTICE TO CONGRESS.—A timely notice of

(e) RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.—Nothing in ths sec-tion shall be construed to preclude the voluntary disclosureof a covered record.

(f) EFFECTIVE DATE.—This section shall take effect
on the date of enactment of this Act and apply to any
photograph created before, on, or after that date that is
a covered record.
